

Review August Automotive Roundtable in Beijing, 2017 - New China Cyber Security Law -

The new China Cyber Security Law took effect on June 1, 2017, which poses many questions and insecurities for all companies operating in China, especially for those that handle employee and customer data cross-border.

The August Automotive Roundtable gathered the automotive industry players and related service providers in Accenture's office to discuss these hot issues.





Mr. Ling Yi, Key Account Manager, China Unicom Smart Connection Co., Ltd. introduced the new Cyber Security Law and its background. He pointed out this law will have the impact on the operator of key info infrastructure, offshore data storage, and migration of IDC, cloud service, etc for the Wholly Foreign Owned Enterprise; while for the Internet Service Provider, there will be tighter grip for the registration and administration. Of the new law the Real Name Registration will have the major impact on the automotive industry. He also introduced the RNR platform that China Unicom built to serve the auto makers, dealers, users, etc to contribute to the automobile connectivity.



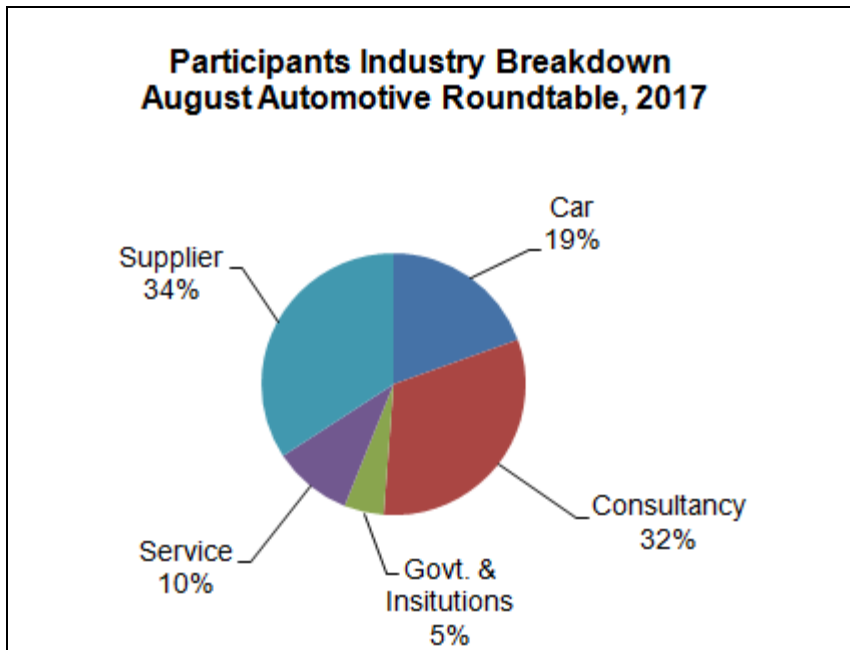
Mr. Wenjun Jia, Senior Manager, Accenture Technology Consulting provided the **China Cyber Security Law Interpretation** within his presentation. According to his estimation, many requirements are currently broad and ambiguous. Ancillary regulations and standards on classified cyber security protection systems, specific scope and protection requirement on CII, cross-border data transfer, and certification and testing on certain network services and products may be ON THE WAY. He believes the law will be implemented through a series of published, proposed and forthcoming ancillary regulations and standards, which may change regulatory environment, and bring significant compliance challenge.



Mr. Michael Adick, Managing Director, Auto Industry, Accenture Greater China as the moderator chaired the event and raised several interesting questions for the panel discussion, incl. How global firms manage the employee data under this new law? How to put in place to be compliant with the new law? How global firms will be operating in China under this law?, etc.
